Before you know it, summer will be here. It can be quite a transition for both children and parents. Students have had a regular schedule and parents have come to depend on routines. 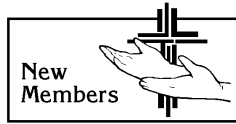

So three years ago St. Felicitas had a program that sounded appealing to me, called "New Beginnings" at the end of the series, I thought this is a way to give back to the church. There were several organizations you could join. I chose the Legion of Mary, because I could get back to helping people in need. Jesus said He came not to be served, but to serve. To imitate Him we should always be ready to do good deeds. If you have lost a loved one, and you don't know what to do with your time and energy, come join us. There are many lonely and abandoned people out there who would love to visit with us. They love to tell us their stories.
