

**CLUSTER REPORT:
THE NINTH MEETING OF
THE CLUSTER PLANNING AND COORDINATION TEAM**

The ninth meeting of the Cluster Planning Team (CPT) of the six Euclid Parishes convened March 17, 2008 at Holy Cross. Facilitator John Kelleher presided, assisted by Chairperson Mary Muehle.

The Cluster Planning Team (CPT) devoted this meeting to shaping the broad structure of the recommendation it is preparing to send to Bishop Lennon.

During the coming month the CPT work teams will be meeting to add some detail to the broad structure of the plan. At its April 21st meeting, the Cluster Planning Team will prepare a presentation to be given to the cluster parishes. According to the *Cluster Planning and Coordination Handbook* the next steps will provide opportunities for feedback from the parishes. These opportunities are to be provided first to Parish Pastoral Councils, Finance Councils, and Staffs. After the feedback of these groups are incorporated into the plan, Town Meetings are to be held to allow for parishioners' feedback

To these ends, the following meetings have been scheduled –

Monday, April 21, from 7 to 9 pm: The regular monthly meeting of the CPT will convene at St. Felicitas.

Tuesday, April 29, 2008, from 7 to 9 pm: **Meeting of Parish Pastoral Councils, Finance Councils, and Staffs from all six Euclid parishes.** This meeting will take place at St. William. This will be an opportunity for the members of these councils and staffs to hear the broad outline of the recommendation being formed and to provide feedback to it.

Monday, May 19, 2008, from 7 to 9 pm: **The regular monthly meeting of the CPT** will convene at St. Paul. At this meeting the CPT will consider feedback from the groups that met on April 29.

Tuesday, May 27, 2008, from 7 to 9 pm: **TOWN MEETING at each Euclid parish** for presentation of the broad outline of the recommendation being formed to each parish as a whole.

Subsequent CPT meetings will bring together feedback from the parish town meetings and flesh out the details of the recommendation which is to be submitted to Bishop Lennon in September.
